An independent panel appointed by the Aviation Press Club will judge the essays on the grounds of writing standard, accuracy and interest to the aviation community. The essay must be previously unpublished and may not total more than 4000 words.

Essays must include footnotes to display the source for any quotation, and data used and view or interpretation which the author has summarised and a comprehensive bibliography listing the sources used to research the essay. By entering the competition, entrants grant CASA a permanent, irrevocable, royalty-free, non-exclusive licence to publish their essays, and to amend or make changes to those essays for editorial reasons.
