<b>Non- Australian citizens</b>	Applicants who are not Australian citizens must undergo an Immigration Check regardless of their age.  Under 18 years of age applicant: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Section 2 of the application form must be completed or your application will not be accepted.</li> </ul> Over 18 years of age applicant: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applicant must hold a valid ASIC or AVID <b>OR</b> submit an application for an ASIC or AVID with the SPL application.</li> <li>If you hold an ASIC that has not been issued by CASA a certified copy must be included with this application.</li> </ul> Note: your immigration check can only be completed once you have arrived in Australia.
<b>Passport photos and specimen signature</b>	Applicants are required to provide 2 identical passport-sized photographs that meet the requirements below: <p><b>Applicant Photograph:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Must have been taken within the last six months;</li> <li>Portrait format: between 35mm and 40mm wide and between 45mm and 50mm high;</li> <li>With good quality colour on high quality paper, no ink marks on the image;</li> <li>Appropriate brightness and contrast to show skin tones correctly; resolution not grainy; sharp focus and clear;</li> <li>One photograph must be certified as a true likeness of the applicant;</li> <li>Attach one photo FACE UP – the photo image should be visible – use an adhesive on the back of the photo and DO NOT staple or tape over the top of the photo – this photo is scanned, so ensure it is not marked in any way.</li> <li>Attach one photo FACE DOWN – the certification details on the back of the photo should be visible – attach the photo so that it can be lifted and the photo image checked with the FACE UP photo.</li> <li>Be of your head and top of shoulders; looking straight at the camera, show your shoulders square on (not portrait style with you looking over one shoulder);</li> <li>Show your face square on with both ears visible (if the hair covers the ears, both edges of the face must be visible);</li> <li>Be taken with a neutral expression with your mouth closed, be close-up, so the head takes up most of the photograph (70-80% - see diagram on page 3 of the application form);</li> <li>Have a plain, light-coloured background; taken with uniform lighting (no shadows across the face);</li> <li>Show eyes clearly open and visible, not obscured by hair, show your eyes clearly through glasses, if worn, with no flash reflection from the glasses, and no tinted lenses; if possible, avoid heavy frames;</li> <li>Show you without any hat or other head covering – if you wear a head-covering for religious reasons, we will accept a photograph of you wearing this, but features must be visible from the top of your forehead to the tip of your chin, and from both sides of the face.</li> </ul> <p><b>Applicant Signature:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Be witnessed by the same person certifying the proof of identity documents and the applicant's photograph;</li> <li>Be contained within the signature box and be written using a black pen.</li> </ul>

	<p><b>Tertiary Identification Documents (TID):</b></p> <p><b>Note</b> – A TID must set out the applicant's name and current address.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A foreign photographic driver's licence; (PID must be a current passport)</li> <li>• A signed statement by the applicant's employer or former employer about that employment;</li> <li>• Copy (certified by an Australian Registrar of Titles or similar officer) of a record issued under a law about land titles;</li> <li>• A document issued by an Australian rating authority (local government) from its records about land ownership or occupation;</li> <li>• A document issued by an Australian bank or financial institution from its records about a mortgage or other security given by applicant;</li> <li>• An extract from the electoral roll compiled by the Australian Electoral Commission;</li> <li>• A record issued under a law in force in Australia other than a law about land titles (eg State issued proof of identity cards that set out the applicant’s name and current address)</li> </ul>

The standards are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Completed or still undertaking secondary school education in Australia or New Zealand, or have completed the equivalent of an Australian secondary school education in a foreign country where one of the principle mediums of instruction was English; or</li> <li>2. Worked 3 of the preceding 5 years in Australia, New Zealand, or a specified country. Specified countries are; United Kingdom, Republic of Ireland, United States of America, and Canada (for Canada, proof of English language proficiency may still be required); or</li> <li>3. Has met or exceeded the general English test criteria as specified in Civil Aviation Order (CAO) 40.0 Appendix 3. The 3 internationally recognised general English tests that CASA accepts are; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• International English Language Testing System (IELTS); with an overall grade of 5.5 on condition that no single test area has a score of less than 5.0.</li> <li>• Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC-SP); with the following minimum test scores: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ listening — 350</li> <li>○ reading — 300</li> <li>○ speaking — 160</li> <li>○ writing — 140</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Internet-based test (TOEFL iBT) with a test score of 71</li> <li>○ Computer-based test (TOEFL CBT) with a test score of 197</li> <li>○ Paper-based test (TOEFL PB) with a test score of 530</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>4. Completed a CASA approved general English language course.</li> <li>5. Has been assessed as a fluent general English speaker by a person approved under Section 9A of CAO 40.0. If the assessor is not satisfied the applicant is a fluent speaker, the applicant <b>MUST</b> provide documentary evidence satisfying one of the other standards.</li> </ol> <p>In the absence of documentary evidence of the SPL applicant addressing standards 1 or 2, the applicant may swear a statutory declaration stating they meet the relevant standard. The declaration must include details outlining the basis for meeting that standard. (E.g.
