Appointment of authorised persons to issue maintenance releases

1 Comencement

The instrument commences on 27 June 2011.

2 Revocation

Instrument CASA 127/95 is revoked.

3 Definitions

In this instrument:

CASR 1998 means the Civil Aviation Safety Regulations 1998.

maintenance release inspection, or *MR inspection* has the same meaning as in subregulation 47 (6) of CAR 1988.

Note Maintenance release inspection means "an inspection carried out on an aircraft for the purpose of determining whether a maintenance release for the aircraft should be issued".

SQC means the system of quality control required under subregulation 30 (2D) of CAR 1988.

4 Appointment of authorised persons to issue maintenance releases

I appoint each person included in the class of persons mentioned in an item in Schedule 1 to be an *authorised person* to issue a maintenance release (*MR*) for regulation 43 of CAR 1988, subject to the conditions mentioned for the item.

Schedule 1 Classes of authorised persons and conditions

Item	Class of persons	
1	Bodies corporate who	

Bodies corporate who hold a certificate of approval (*CofA*) to engage in the maintenance of Australian aircraft.

Conditions

The body corporate may issue an MR only if its CofA covers maintenance of the aircraft type.

The person who conducts an MR inspection and signs the MR for the body corporate must be a person, or included in a class of persons, who, for the SQC is permitted to sign an MR.

The person (the *Person*) who signs an MR for the body corporate:

- (a) must:
 - (i) hold an aircraft engineer licence (*AEL*) issued under Part 66 of CASR 1998; and
 - (ii) hold the AEL in a category or subcategory appropriate for the MR inspection; and
 - (iii) have certified the completion of the maintenance for the aircraft for which the MR is to be released; or
- (b) must:
 - (i) hold an airworthiness authority (AA) appropriate for the MR inspection; and
 - (ii) have certified the completion of the maintenance for the aircraft for which the MR is to be released; or
- (c) must:
 - (i) be authorised to carry out maintenance under regulation 42ZC of CAR 1988 (*CAR 42ZC*); and
 - (ii) having received, from each person qualified to issue it, each relevant certificate of completion of maintenance for the aircraft for which the MR is to be released either:
 - (A) have certified the completion of the inspection for the MR; or
 - (B) have co-ordinated the MR inspection to ensure that any maintenance performed during the inspection, which nullified a certification already made in respect of the inspection, has been completed, properly certified and given to the Person.

2 Individuals who hold a CofA to engage in the maintenance of aircraft in Australian territory.

The individual may issue an MR only if his or her CofA covers maintenance of the aircraft type.

The MR must be signed by the individual, or on his or her behalf by a person, or by a person included in a class of persons, who, for the SQC is permitted to sign an MR.

The person who signs the MR:

- (a) must:
 - (i) hold a AEL issued under Part 66 of CASR 1998; and
 - (ii) hold the AEL in a category or subcategory appropriate for the MR inspection; and
 - (iii) have certified the completion of the maintenance; or
- (b) must:
 - (i) hold an AA appropriate for the MR inspection; and
 - (ii) have certified the completion of the maintenance; or
- (c) must:
 - (i) be a person permitted to carry out maintenance under CAR 42ZC; and
 - (ii) either:
 - (A) have certified completion of the inspection for the MR; or
 - (B) have co-ordinated the MR inspection to ensure that any maintenance performed during the inspection, which nullified a certification already made in respect of the inspection, has been completed and properly certified.
- Bodies corporate in a contracting State who:
 - (a) hold a CofA; and
 - (b) are permitted under CAR 42ZD to carry out maintenance on Class A aircraft; and
 - (c) are authorised under CAR 42ZN to certify completion of maintenance.

The body corporate may only issue an MR for a Class A aircraft, and only in accordance with the aircraft operator's maintenance control manual.

If the body corporate is the operator of the aircraft, it may only issue an MR in a Contracting State for maintenance carried out in that Contracting State.

If the body corporate is not the operator of the aircraft, it may only issue an MR in a Contracting State for maintenance carried out by the body corporate in that Contracting State.

Conditions

The person who signs an MR for the body corporate:

- (a) must be a person, or included in a class of persons, who, for the SQC, is permitted to sign an MR; and
- (b) must:
 - (i) be the person who certified the completion of the maintenance; or
 - (ii) be the person who co-ordinated the MR inspection to ensure that any maintenance performed during the inspection, which nullified a certification already made in respect of the inspection, has been completed and properly certified.
