CASA EX116/23 — Flight Simulators for Training and Checking (Aviair Pty Ltd) Exemption 2023

1 Name

- (1) This instrument is CASA EX116/23 Flight Simulators for Training and Checking (Aviair Pty Ltd) Exemption 2023.
- (2) This instrument may also be cited as instrument CASA EX116/23.

2 Application

This instrument applies to Aviair.

3 Definitions

Note In this instrument, certain terms and expressions have the same meaning as they have in the *Civil Aviation Act 1988* and the regulations. These include *EASA* and *flight simulator*.

In this instrument:

Aviair means Aviair Pty Ltd, ARN 417366.

4 Exemption — conduct of flight tests for air transport pilot licences

- (1) For the purposes of regulation 11.160 of CASR, a member of Aviair's personnel who is the holder of a flight crew licence undertaking a flight test for an air transport pilot licence is exempt from compliance with paragraph 61.245(1)(a) of CASR, to the extent that:
 - (a) the flight test for the air transport pilot licence is conducted in the flight simulator for the DHC-8 aeroplane, located in Hyderabad, India and operated by Flight Simulation Techniques Centre Private Limited, which has the simulator serial number FlightSafety/5022; and
 - (b) at the time the flight test for the air transport pilot licence is undertaken, a flight simulation training device qualification certificate issued by EASA for the flight simulator is in force and is valid; and

(c) a copy of the qualification certificate mentioned in paragraph (c) is included in Aviair's exposition.

Note EASA issued flight simulation training device qualification certificate FSTD No. EU-A0197 for the flight simulator mentioned in paragraph (a) on 13 February 2019. The certificate is subject to conditions mentioned in the certificate.

(2) The exemption is subject to the conditions mentioned in subsection 7(1).

5 Exemption — conduct of instrument proficiency checks

- (1) For the purposes of regulation 11.160 of CASR, a member of Aviair's personnel for a DHC-8 aeroplane who is the holder of an instrument rating and is undertaking an instrument proficiency check for a DHC-8 aeroplane is exempt from compliance with subregulation 61.805(1), paragraphs 61.805(2)(e) and (f), subregulation 61.805(6), subregulation 61.880(1), paragraphs 61.880(3)(e) and (f) and subregulation 61.880(6) of CASR, to the extent that:
 - (a) the instrument proficiency check is conducted in the flight simulator for the DHC-8 aeroplane, located in Hyderabad, India and operated by Flight Simulation Techniques Centre Private Limited, which has the simulator serial number FlightSafety/5022; and
 - (b) at the time the instrument proficiency check is conducted, a flight simulation training device qualification certificate issued by EASA for the flight simulator is in force and is valid; and
 - (c) a copy of the qualification certificate mentioned in paragraph (c) is included in Aviair's exposition.

Note EASA issued flight simulation training device qualification certificate FSTD No. EU-A0197 for the flight simulator mentioned in paragraph (a) on 13 February 2019. The certificate is subject to conditions mentioned in the certificate.

(2) The exemption is subject to the conditions mentioned in subsection 7(1).

6 Exemption — use of approved flight simulators for training or checking

- (1) For the purposes of regulation 11.160 of CASR, Aviair is exempt from compliance with subregulation 121.510(2) of CASR, to the extent that:
 - (a) training or checking undertaken by a flight crew member of Aviair's personnel for the purposes of meeting Aviair's obligations under Part 121 of CASR is for a DHC-8 aeroplane; and
 - (b) the training or checking is conducted in the flight simulator for the DHC-8 aeroplane, located in Hyderabad, India and operated by Flight Simulation Techniques Centre Private Limited, which has the simulator serial number FlightSafety/5022; and
 - (c) at the time the training or checking is conducted, a flight simulation training device qualification certificate issued by EASA for the flight simulator is in force and is valid; and
 - (d) a copy of the qualification certificate mentioned in paragraph (c) is included in Aviair's exposition.

Note EASA issued flight simulation training device qualification certificate FSTD No. EU-A0197 for the flight simulator mentioned in paragraph (b) on 13 February 2019. The certificate is subject to conditions mentioned in the certificate.

(2) The exemption is subject to the conditions mentioned in subsection 7(2).

7 Conditions

- (1) For the purposes of regulation 11.205 of CASR, it is a condition on the exemptions mentioned in sections 4 and 5 that the member of Aviair's personnel must be satisfied that Aviair has procedures in its exposition for the quality assurance of the flight simulator to ensure:
 - (a) that the EASA certification mentioned in paragraphs 4(1)(b), 5(1)(b) and 6(1)(c) is in force for the flight simulator and is valid at the time that a flight crew member undertakes the flight test, instrument proficiency check or training and checking concerned (as applicable); and
 - (b) that, at the time a flight crew member undertakes the flight test, instrument proficiency check or training and checking concerned (as applicable), the flight simulator is suitable for Aviair's Part 121 operations.
- (2) For the purposes of regulation 11.205 of CASR, each of the following is a condition on the exemption mentioned in section 6:
 - (a) Aviair must have procedures in its exposition for the quality assurance of the flight simulator, to ensure:
 - (i) that the EASA certification mentioned in paragraphs 4(1)(b), 5(1)(b) and 6(1)(c) is in force for the flight simulator and is valid at the time that a flight crew member undertakes the flight test, instrument proficiency check or training and checking concerned (as applicable); and
 - (ii) that, at the time a flight crew member undertakes the flight test, instrument proficiency check or training and checking concerned (as applicable), the flight simulator is suitable for Aviair's Part 121 operations;
 - (b) if a new flight simulation training device qualification certificate is issued by EASA for the flight simulator, Aviair must email a copy of the certificate to CASA at <u>regservices@casa.gov.au</u> by the end of 7 days after Aviair becomes aware that the certificate has been issued, and Aviair's email must refer to this instrument and to the condition in this paragraph;
 - (c) if a compliance monitoring system audit is conducted of the flight simulator, Aviair must email a copy of the audit report to CASA at <u>regservices@casa.gov.au</u> by the end of 7 days after Aviair becomes aware that the audit report has been signed, and Aviair's email must refer to this instrument and to the condition in this paragraph.

8 Repeal

This instrument is repealed at the end of 30 November 2026.
