### Rule reminder

- Remember to stay low!
- Remember: don't be a space invader!
- Only people who are helping you operate your drone are allowed nearby.
- Remember to steer clear! You must not fly directly above populated areas or events.
- Remember: don't be a hazard!
- Flying your drone safely means being properly prepared before you fly.
- That's right: fly away, don't delay!
- Remember to keep your drone in flight and in sight!
- You're only permitted to be in control of one drone at a time. Any more would be too much to handle!
- National parks are a no-go zone to protect the wildlife.
- Check your drone safety app for locations of airports with control towers!
- That's right: you aren't permitted to fly a drone outside in the dark. Pack it up and call it a day.
- Your drone buzzing around might get in the way of emergency services aircraft and endanger lives. Keep your distance during emergencies!
- Correct! A few simple steps are all you need to make sure your flying spot is good to go!
- That's right! There are easy-to-use drone safety apps that will tell you if your area is safe to fly. Don't forget to check local government laws and signage as well!
