1.	You must always fly your drone higher than 120 m from the ground. False	Remember to stay low!
2.	Fill in the blank: You must keep your drone at least 30 metres from other people when flying.	Remember: don't be a space invader!
3.	Another person is permitted nearby if they are helping me operate my drone. True	Only people who are helping you operate your drone are allowed nearby.
4.	Which of the following is a permitted safe place to fly? d. None of the above.	Remember to steer clear! You must not fly directly above populated areas or events.
5.	You should not fly near police, firefighters or other emergency operations. Why not? b. You will get in the way and cause problems for emergency crews.	Remember: don't be a hazard!
6.	Before every flight, you should: e. all of the above.	Flying your drone safely means being properly prepared before you fly.
7.	What should you do if you become aware of a crewed aircraft flying towards your location? c. Land as soon as it is safe to do so	That's right: fly away, don't delay!
8.	Keeping your drone within your visual line-of-sight means: b. seeing it with your own eyes.	Remember to keep your drone in flight and in sight!
9.	Using the right app, it's safe to control up to four drones at once. False	You're only permitted to be in control of one drone at a time. Any more would be too much to handle!
10.	National parks are a great place to fly a drone. False	National parks are a no-go zone to protect the wildlife.
11.	Fill in the gaps: If your drone weighs more than 250 g, you need to stay at least 5.5 km away from airports that have a control tower . You can check a drone safety app to help you.	Check your drone safety app for locations of airports with control towers!
12.	Once it gets dark, you can keep flying as long as your drone has lights. False	That's right: you aren't permitted to fly a drone outside in the dark. Pack it up and call it a day.
13.	It's okay to fly a drone near a house fire to see if anyone needs rescuing. False	Your drone buzzing around might get in the way of emergency services aircraft and endanger lives. Keep your distance during emergencies!
14.	When is it okay to fly over a public sporting oval? d. Only when all of the above are true	Correct! A few simple steps are all you need to make sure your flying spot is good to go!
15.	There's no easy way to find out where you can and can't fly your drone. False	That's right! There are easy-to-use drone safety apps that will tell you if your area is safe to fly. Don't forget to check local government laws and signage as well!
