CASA OAR 037/24 – Temporary Restricted Areas – Declaration and Determination (Byron Group TIBA) Instrument 2024

1 Name

This instrument is CASA OAR 037/24 – Temporary Restricted Areas – Declaration and Determination (Byron Group TIBA) Instrument 2023.

2 Duration

This instrument:

- (a) commences on 24 February 2024; and
- (b) is repealed at the end of 24 February 2024.

Note Dates in this provision are in Coordinated Universal Time (UTC).

3 Declaration of temporary restricted areas

- (1) I declare each area specified in Schedule 1 to be a temporary restricted area.
- (2) Any conditions in accordance with which the flight of aircraft within each area is permitted are set out in Schedule 1.

4 Activation of declaration

The declaration of each area specified in Schedule 1 is activated by the event mentioned in the activation clause for the area.

5 Determination that ATS are at variance with Annex 11

- (1) I determine that, in accordance with Annex 11 to the Chicago Convention, the air traffic services (*ATS*) to be provided for the airspace within each declared area are services that are at variance with the ATS that would otherwise be provided, in accordance with the Annex, for the airspace within the declared area.
- (2) The services that are at variance are set out in Schedule 1.

6 Directions instrument for temporary restricted areas outside Australian territory

This instrument operates subject to the effect of CASA 57/23 – Australian-administered Airspace outside Australian Territory – Temporary TIBA Areas – Directions Instrument 2023.
