CASA 23/24 — Aviation Colour Vision Assessment Determination 2024

1 Name

This instrument is *CASA 23/24 — Aviation Colour Vision Assessment Determination 2024*.

2 Duration

This instrument:

- (a) commences on the date it is signed; and
- (b) is repealed at the end of the day before the day three (3) years from the commencement date.

3 Definitions

In this instrument:

Australian Operational Colour Vision Assessment has the same meaning as it has in the Flight Examiners Handbook Appendix A.

Colour Assessment and Diagnosis Test has the same meaning as it has in Part 2 of the Colour Vision Assessment Instructions.

Colour Vision Assessment Instructions means the document published by CASA, titled *Australian Operational Colour Vision Assessment - Eligibility and Test Components*, Version 1.0 dated May 2024, as it exists at the time this instrument is made.

flight examiner has the meaning given by regulation 61.010 of CASR.

Flight Examiners Handbook Appendix A means the document published by CASA, titled *Appendix A – Flight Examiners Handbook – Australian Operational Colour Vision Assessment (AOCVA)*, Version 1.0 dated May 2024, as it exists at the time this instrument is made.

4 Determination

- (1) The Australian Operational Colour Vision Assessment, administered in accordance with Part 1 of the Colour Vision Assessment Instructions by a flight examiner who is approved by CASA to administer the test, is determined as a test for the purposes of paragraphs 67.150(6)(c) and 67.155(6)(c) of CASR.
- (2) The Colour Assessment and Diagnosis Test, administered in accordance with Part 2 of the Colour Vision Assessment Instructions, is determined as a test for the purposes of paragraphs 67.150(6)(c) and 67.155(6)(c) of CASR.

Note The *Colour Vision Assessment Instructions* state that the Colour Assessment and Diagnosis Test may not be used as a test for whether the aviation medical standard is met under paragraphs 67.150(6)(c) and 67.155(6)(c) of CASR in circumstances where a person has previously been assessed using the Australian Operational Colour Vision Assessment and has failed that assessment.
