It's not worth missing your flight. Don't risk being delayed at check-in or security – pack right!

Dangerous goods are items that can be harmful or unsafe on an aircraft. They might be flammable, explosive, toxic, or react dangerously with other substances.

Some dangerous goods are banned from flights. Others can be packed, but only with airline approval or special packing.

Common dangerous goods include:

- Vapes and e-cigarettes
- Batteries and power banks
- · Aerosols and toiletries
- · Cleaning products and chemicals
- Fuels and petrol-powered items
- Matches, lighters, and fireworks.

Airports routinely screen carry-on and checked baggage for dangerous goods. If dangerous goods are detected in your checked baggage, your bag may be removed, and you may miss your flight. When you check in online or at the airport, you must declare any dangerous goods in your baggage.

If you fail to declare or make a misleading or false declaration, you could face serious penalties – up to 7 years in jail.


